### Idea

This seminar will focus broadly on the concepts and issues of economic growth and development in the light of institutions and governance. We will discuss the fundamental, contemporary theories of economic growth and development, the determinants of growth and development and the new wave of globalization, the role of institutions and governance in promoting growth and alleviating economic inequality. Few nations have developed; many are developing and emerging, yet many are under-developed. How "best" can this transition take place?

Economic growth and development are highly desirable but challenging to achieve in an increasingly globalized, "unequal" world. It suffices to say that a fundamental problem in development is inequality in the allocation of resources and distribution of income and wealth. We will discuss and present pertinent models and thoughts from both historical and contemporary perspectives. Participants will give and share their views and positions on the debates that will be brought up. There will be no room for neutrality (Please note that scientific analysis of objective conditions always necessitates the researcher to take a position).

## Requirements

Participants are required to participate in the Introductory Sessions, Academic Presentation Sessions, and Submission of a final seminar paper. Each participant will give an academic presentation (for 20 minutes) on their preferred topic, followed by a session of discussion and Q & A with the audience (10 minutes). Active participation in the talks is expected of all the participants.

After the presentations, participants will prepare and submit a written work in a seminar paper (approximately 4,000 words for Masters- and 3,000 words for bachelor students) on or before a stipulated date.

Final grades are based on the academic presentation and final seminar paper.

## Seminar Organization & Application Process

**Mandatory introductory lectures** will take place (date and venue to be announced in due course). The objectives of this session are as follows;

- ✚ To provide a background to the subject of Economics of Growth & Development.
- ✚ To present the seminar's structure, introduce the topics, and highlight the nexus of the listed topics.
- ✚ To present a working paper on a pertinent contemporary topic.
- ✚ To discuss relevant comments and questions from the participants.

The **presentations** on selected topics will tentatively take place in February 2022 (exact date, time and venue to be announced). Further information, when necessary, will be communicated in due course.

The deadline for submitting the final seminar papers is the last day of the academic calendar of the Winter Semester.

If you are interested in participating in the seminar, please contact me via an email indicating one or two topics of your choice in the list below and supported with a brief motivation for your preference(s). **The deadline for the application is the 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2021.**

Upon receipt and satisfactory review of each application, you will receive notification of acceptance for participation in the seminar.

**The seminar is limited to 20 participants.** I will treat the applications on a first-come-first-serve basis and case-by-case basis.
